**Subject:** Use of District-Discretionary **Measure K** Funds - Supervisorial District 4

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

**Measure K:** Adopt a resolution authorizing a one-time grant of district-discretionary **Measure K** funds, not to exceed \$20,000, to League of Women Voters (LWV) for New Voices for Youth (NV4Y), an after-school program that trains youth to be leaders through use of media and storytelling, and authorizing the County Manager, or his designee, to execute the grant agreement.

### **BACKGROUND:**

**Measure K** is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by San Mateo County voters in November 2012 and extended in November 2016 for a total of thirty years. The Board of Supervisors ("Board") and County staff have conducted study sessions and community outreach efforts to inform priorities for **Measure K** spending for FY 2017-19.

On May 16, 2017, the Board approved the FY 2017-19 Measure K allocation plan in which the County anticipates Measure K receipts of approximately \$81.6 million annually. The plan included \$7 million in one-time loans or grants during FY 2017-19, divided equally among the five supervisorial districts, for district-discretionary needs and projects. District 4 has submitted a request to use its district-discretionary **Measure K** funds as shown below and described in the Project Summary section of this memorandum:

District 4 (Supervisor Warren Slocum) - League of Women Voters (LWV): Funding for program staff and equipment for an after-school program that trains youth to be leaders through use of media and storytelling.	\$20,000

This item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary **Measure K** funds approved by the Board in December 2018.

## **DISCUSSION:**

On November 7, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved a resolution authorizing a one-time grant of district-specific Measure K funds, not to exceed \$16,290, to the League of Women Voters (LWV) for the New Voices for Youth after-school program to pay for program staff and related equipment to train youth to be leaders through use of media and storytelling.

New Voices for Youth, an after-school program overseen by the League of Women Voters, gives youth in underserved communities the chance to discuss, analyze and research the social issues that touch them in their communities. Students work with experienced instructors to learn the skills needed to create personal profile pieces and short video projects.

Building upon the success of the 2017 New Voices for Youth program, this request will continue to train youth to be leaders through use of media and storytelling with the goal of having 65 youth participate in the program. It promotes civic engagement in underserved youth by teaching them how to make documentary videos. The \$20,000 requested in district-discretionary Measure K funds will be used to pay for program staff and related equipment to train youth to be leaders through use of media. The County Manager's Office will administer and manage the proposed agreement.

The funds will support classes in North Fair Oaks and East Palo Alto, as well as equipment to create and produce the resulting media. The classes teach public speaking, technical skills, story boarding, prioritizing, working together, and leadership.

Funds will be used to pay program staff in the Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall semester classes, from February 2019 to December 2019, at both Siena Youth Center in North Fair Oaks and Boys and Girls Club in East Palo Alto. The funds will also be used to purchase equipment to enhance the classroom experience, to provide a video workshop at the OYE Conference, and for a film festival to highlight the work produced. LWV proposes to use the grant funds as described below:

### **Siena Youth Center in North Fair Oaks - \$7,350**

- **250 total** classroom hours, provided by an instructor at \$27/hour = **\$6,750**
- **40 total** classroom hours, provided by a student assistant at \$15/hour = **\$600**

### **Boys & Girls Club in East Palo Alto - \$6,150**

- **222 total** classroom hours, provided by an instructor at \$25/hour = **\$5,550**
- **40 total** classroom hours, provided by a student assistant at \$15/hour = **\$600**

**Total instruction and preparation cost = \$13,500**

### **Equipment purchases**

- 6 cameras **\$1,500**
- 6 external microphones **\$500**
- 2 MacBook laptops **\$3,000**

**Total Estimated Equipment purchase = \$5,000**

## Other expenses

**OYE Conference** - instructors for video workshop for youth at March OYE conference  
= \$400

**Film Festival** to highlight student film projects = \$1,100

### Total Measure K Request: Not to Exceed \$20,000

The release of funds will be contingent on the execution of an agreement providing for the County's confirmation of the expenditure of funds during FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20 for the purposes stated herein. The County will disburse the funds to the following organization for the purposes described above:
